Approval of Summer School Courses

Approval of COVID-19 Continuous Learning Plan

Dr. Zupin discussed the COVID-19 Continuous Learning Plan stating "A COVID Positive person should stay home and isolate from other people for at least 15 days (day 0 is the first day of symptoms of the date of the day of the positive viral test for asymptomatic persons). People who are in isolation may return to school on day 6 as long as they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications and symptoms have improved. They should wear a mask when around others at home, in public, and at school for an additional 5 days (days 6-10), contract tracing and quarantining close contacts, including family members will not be performed. Masks will be optional in the school".

Mr. Menis made a motion to approve COVID-19 Continuous Learning Plan as presented. Mrs. Kersting Rudd seconded the motion; motion carried 4-0

Approval of Resolution to Transfer Education Funds to Operation Funds

Mr. Tunis Discussed the Resolution to Transfer Education Funds to Operation Funds with the first ten transfers (March-December), each being \$100,000 and the total amount transferred being \$1,000,000. Indicating this is different from the past to keep the financials steadier instead of creating large fluctuations.

Mrs. Kersting Rudd made a motion to approve Resolution to Transfer Education Funds to Operation Funds as presented. Mrs. Brewer seconded the motion; motion carried 4-0.

Project Update

Dr. Zupin shared phase II is continuing. Roofing is expected to arrive at the end of March. High School Gym AC unit bids opened. Estimated cost is \$360K with one bid at \$1,154,300. The timeline and steel costs are all factors. The bid was rejected.

JoAnn Gappa and Dr. Pete presented benefits and challenges of keeping the 6th grade students in the old middle school. The board gave them approval to continue researching and presenting reasons in favor of this at the next board meeting. An action may be taken at that time.
